



Psalm 92 *Bonum est confiteri* (OP)

- Full f* It is a good thing to give ' thanks un·to the ' Lord :  
and to sing praises unto thy ' Name - ' O most ' Highest.
- Full* 2. To tell of thy loving-kindness ' early · in the ' morning :  
and of thy ' truth - ' in the ' night-season.
- D* 3. Upon an instrument of ten strings ' and up·on the ' lute :  
upon a loud ' instrument ' and up·on the ' harp.
- C* 4. For thou Lord hast made me ' glad · through thy ' works :  
and I will rejoice in giving praise, for the oper'ations ' of thy ' hands.
- D* 5. O Lord how glorious ' are thy ' works :  
thy ' thoughts are ' very ' deep.
- C* 6. An unwise man doth not ' well con'sider this :  
and a ' fool · doth not ' under'stand it.
- D mf* 7. When the ungodly are green as the grass,  
and when all the workers of ' wickedness do ' flourish :  
then shall they be destroyed for ever,  
but thou Lord art the most ' Highest for ' ever' more.
- C* 8. For lo thine enemies O Lord, lo thine ' enemies shall ' perish :  
and all the workers of ' wickedness shall ' be de'stroyed.
- D* 9. But mine horn shall be exalted like the ' horn of an ' unicorn :  
for I am a'nointed with ' fresh - ' oil.
- C* 10. Mine eye also shall see his ' lust of mine ' enemies :  
and mine ear shall hear his desire of the ' wicked · that a'rise · up a'gainst me.
- D cresc* 11. The righteous shall ' flourish · like a ' palm-tree :  
and shall spread a'broad · like a ' cedar in ' Libanus.
- C* 12. Such as are planted in the ' house of the ' Lord :  
shall flourish in the ' courts of the ' house of our ' God.
- D f* 13. They also shall bring forth more ' fruit in their ' age :  
and ' shall be ' fat and well ' liking.
- C* 14. That they may shew how true the ' Lord my ' strength is :  
and that there is ' no un'righteousness ' in him.
- Full f* Glory be to the Father, and ' to the ' Son : and ' to the ' Holy ' Ghost;
